National Poetry Day

Yesterday we celebrated National Poetry Day. The theme this year is 'playing with poetry' – a wonderful theme which allows us to be really creative and to enjoy poetry. We will be focusing on poetry throughout the month in our English lessons, story-times and early morning work. Children will have opportunities to read poetry, listen to poetry, share poetry, perform poetry and of course, play with poetry. Every class from Year 1-Year 6 has chosen a poem which they are learning to recite by heart for a special Performance Poetry Assembly on 22nd October. We will share these performances with you on Class Dojo. Children in the EYFS will be focusing on action and nursery rhymes, which helps them to build their phonic skills. Learning poetry by heart and performing it to a large audience is part of our Oracy programme. It enhances fluency, pronunciation, and reading comprehension, as children engage with rhythm, rhyme, and varied vocabulary. This also helps with memory, and develops critical thinking and public speaking abilities through performance and audience interaction. Why not read some poetry together at home this month!

Building Update

Our building work is progressing and construction is now in Phase 2 of the project. This involves structural works and groundworks in preparation for the construction of the new extension. Thank you to the entire school community, our dedicated kitchen staff and our wonderful construction team, as school has been running seamlessly so far this term.
