Think Before You Type and Share



Background:

We have previously discussed the dangers of sharing personal information online, such as our addresses or our phone numbers. We should also be careful with sharing our personal views and opinions online especially if they are likely to cause upset to someone else or if they are to cause trouble for us. It's important that children realise that once something is shared online it has the power of remaining there for a very long time. Deleting information will remove it from where we placed it but it could have been shared or captured before that. Personal opinions and views or emotions should be expressed with caution over the internet. If we are upset or angry by someone or something online, we should always stop and think before we type and share.
