#### **School Review Visit**

On Wednesday, leaders from our Trust visited school to carry out our scheduled school review. These visits are designed to support our ongoing improvement journey. I accompanied the team as we visited classrooms, spoke with children, and reviewed their work. The leaders were incredibly impressed by the progress the school has made over the past year and were very complimentary about the quality of education our children receive. They were particularly impressed by our highly effective approach to reading and phonics, alongside our strong maths curriculum, outcomes, and pupils' positive attitudes towards the subject. Our children spoke confidently, thoughtfully and with real pride in their school – they are wonderful ambassadors and, as always, made me immensely proud.
