### Maths

- Research the heights of your five favourite animals and then draw them in height order.
- Write number sentences to add the number of legs on different animals e.g. zebra + flamingo = 6
- 3. Find out how many miles Maulden is from the nearest beach, from the nearest mountains and from the nearest city.
- 4. Draw a picture of Our Amazing World using as many 2D shapes as possible. Try to include circles, triangles, squares, rectangles and diamonds.
- 5. When it is 4 o'clock in the afternoon in Maulden, what time it is in other places around Our Amazing World?

### Science

- 1. Make a poster about different types of animals fish, birds, amphibians, reptiles and mammals.
- Watch documentary footage of animals in the wild.
   Try making a mini wildlife documentary about your own pet.
- 3. Go tree spotting how can you identify different trees from their leaves or bark?
- 4. Grow your own plants from seeds. Take photos and measurements as they grow.

## Computing

- 1. With an adult, explore the Hubble Telescope website. Check out those amazing gallery images!
- 2. With an adult, search the internet for fascinating space facts. Make your very own space fact book.
- With an adult search the internet for images and facts about amazing woodlands or forests around the world.

- 2. Write a playtime guide for other children to explain ways of being respectful to others and working as a team.

## Our Amazing World Summer Term

### Art/Design/Music

- Choose and draw or paint an animal that could be found in the local woods.
- 2. Choose an endangered animal to draw or paint. Find out where it lives and why it is endangered.
- Design a collage of plants or an animal using natural materials.
- 4. Make an animal mask
- 5. Make a bird feeder for your garden. Then watch out every day for bird visitors!
- 6. Draw or paint the camouflage markings of a range of animals such as leopards, giraffes or tigers.
- Create your own animal, plant, nature or space song.
- 8. Find out about famous artists who have used the woodland for inspiration, such as Andy Goldsworthy.





### English

- 1. Find out about unusual pets using non-fiction books or the internet. Download a photograph of the most interesting pet and write their name. What does it eat? How should it be cared for?
- 2. Make a scrapbook all about your pet, or a pet belonging to someone you know. What is the pet's name? Write about interesting things they do and things they need to stay healthy.
- 3. Write out your favourite animal nursery rhyme or poem in your best handwriting.
- Make an Amazing Animals factsheet about 3 animals - once carnivore, one herbivore and one omnivore.

### History/Geography

- 1. Locate on a world map where all your favourite animals come from. What is the weather like in that country?
- 2. Find out about animals that live in hot and cold countries.
- 3. Find out about a famous person from history. Draw them and write 5 facts about them.
- 4. Draw the flags of all four countries in the United Kingdom and also the Union Jack.

### RE/PSHE/PE

- 1. Challenge your family to a jumping, skipping or hopping competition and record the results who is the winner?
- 2. Write a list of everything you are grateful for in Our Amazing World.
- See how many star jumps you can do in one minute and then practise to try to beat your own record.
