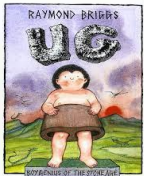


Year 3 Autumn Term 2026

- Our topics for this term are 'Creation and Covenant' and 'Prophecy and Promise'

- We have child-led collective worship in class every week in addition to teacher led worship.



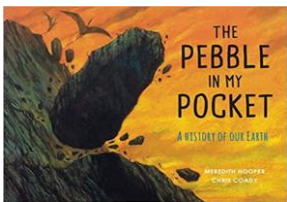
English: We start by looking at the book 'Ug' by Raymond Briggs to link with our history topic of Stone Age. We will also be looking at 'Pebble in my Pocket' during the first half term. Ensuring that the children are exposed to a range of genres throughout. Each class will choose a Class text that they will be reading every day.

Writing Skills: To use imaginative description. Create characters, settings and plots. Use alliteration effectively. Use similes effectively.

Grammar Skills: To use inverted commas and revisit use of capitals for proper nouns.

Reading Skills: To develop fluency and automation in reading through effective decoding skills. To read words accurately and to understand texts. Draw inferences from reading and inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions.

Please read at home a minimum of 20 minutes a night. Reading records need to be filled in and signed a minimum of 5 times a week



Maths: These are the topics we will be covering this term: Properties of Number, Place Value and Partitioning, Measurement, Addition and Subtraction, Multiplication and Division.

Maths will be taught in sets this year.

Skills: Place value of each digit in a four-digit whole number is recognised.

Rounding any number accurately to the nearest 10, 100 or 1000. To solve two-step number problems, including missing number problems. To use column addition and subtraction to add and subtract numbers up to four digits.



History

'Prehistoric Britain – The Stone Age'

We will be looking at the events during Prehistoric Britain - The Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age and placing them in chronological order. We will be exploring a range of artefacts and learning what they were used for during this time. The children will learn what life was like in Britain during these eras.

Science:

We are starting the year looking at Rocks and Soils, where children will be identifying some physical properties of rocks, how fossils and soil are made. In the second half term, we will be looking at 'Forces and Magnets', looking at which forces act upon our bodies and materials that are magnetic.

Computing:

- Computing Skills
- Connecting Computers – the children will be looking into what a digital device is, what they can do, how they can help us and how they are connected
- E-Safety

Key skills: To connect, to collect and to communicate.

- We are exploring the Bob Marley song 'Three Little Birds' as well as looking at how we can read music.
