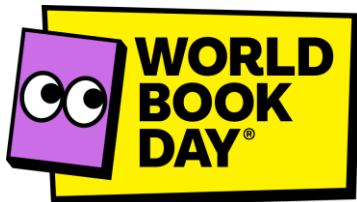
🎵 🎶 Choir at Exeter School’s Festival of Singing 🎵 🎶
