On Wednesday 21st October we were visited by two members of the Local Authority as part of their Quality Assurance of the education being provided by all Trafford Schools – I thought I would share their feedback.

This was my first visit to Kings Road and from entering the car park to being greeted by the Headteacher, there was a tangible family feel to Kings Road. At the beginning of the day I observed warm and natural interactions between staff, parents and children; meaning that the feeling of community and therefore a feeling of belonging permeates throughout the school.

Leaders are proud of the unique context of Kings Road and their ethos of 'Excellence without Compromise'

Through my discussions with leaders across the school, it is clear that leaders' vision for excellence is shared with his senior leadership team who provide a range of complementary skills to meet the school's shared vision for 'excellence'. Senior leaders talked passionately about the distributed leadership responsibilities across the school and how decisions include input from leaders across the school.

Overall, leaders were able to articulate "the why" behind their strategic decision-making and their choice of school development priorities for 2024-2025 which were formed with the careful analysis of quantitative data and an understanding of their school's context. When asked about why certain elements were not included as explicit SDPAs, leaders could explain their rationale clearly.

Passion permeates Kings Road. There is a passion for the children and the community and securing excellence in the quality of education they receive. This but was evident within leaders and staff during the visit. It was a privilege to visit Kings Road today.
