Thanks to Chantelle Gibbs and Billie Bell for volunteering on the trip to the choir and to the choir for representing the school so well yet again.

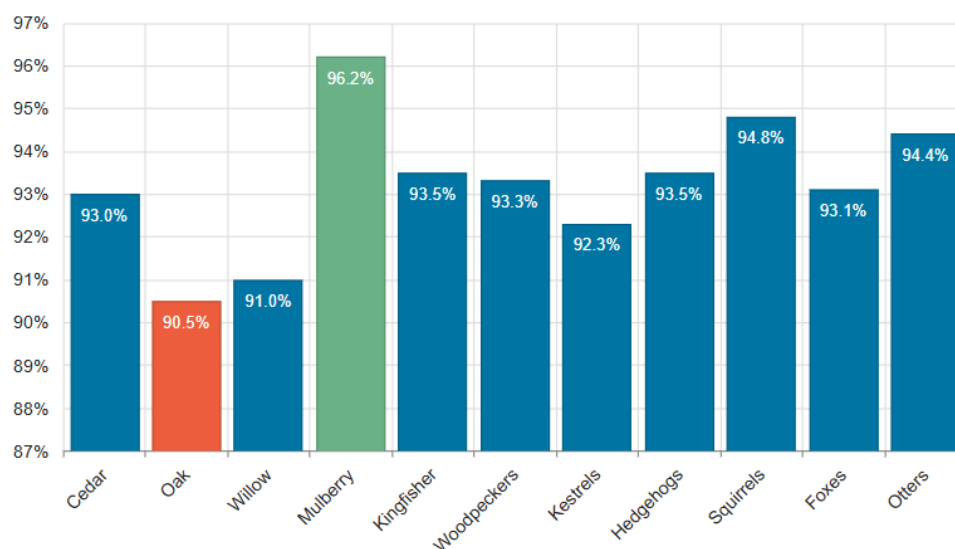
