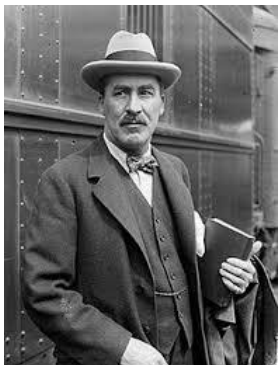


Careers in History

Historian

Archivists

Cultural Heritage Managers
