Reminder—Preschool Late Collection Penalty

All children attending our preschool must be collected at the end of each session. Due to insurance issues we are unable to care for any child on the premises prior to 9.00am and after 3.00pm. Should any parent/carer be late in collecting their child then we are entitled to impose a penalty of **£15 per 1/4 hour late**. This fee is to cover extra costs incurred in caring for the child. All drop off and collection times are accurately recorded as a government requirement by the staff for reference.

Christow Toy Swap



Back in early September, when the newly appointed members of the School Council met for the first time, one of our year 6 reps spoke passionately about the toy industry and how it is terribly wasteful. Did you know that 80% of toys end up in incinerators, just like in the Toy Story 3 climatic movie scene? Our year 6 rep really wanted to use his new School Council role to spread news of this. In the first instance, he proposed workshops to upcycle unwanted soft toys and so was born the **'Franken-Teddy Workshops'**, run after school, which saw children making new teddies with parts of old ones taken apart and sewn together! These 'mash ups' excited many of our pupils and some have even turned this into a hobby at home! As a result, we have saved many soft toys from being doomed to incinerator waste.

The School Council, led by Mrs Hill, decided to take this theme of toy waste even further, agreeing that a 'Toy Swap' in time for Christmas would not only be the perfect way to encourage reuse of old and unwanted toys but would also help families out at this financially straining time. So we set about collecting toys from our Christow families before swapping them with another local school, Dunsford Primary School (who were collecting for their Christmas fair). This way, both schools would have new and unseen toys, and save children returning home with toys they had donated! The School Council led an assembly on how the 'Toy Swap' would work. Each child was to be given a token and in the spirit of Christmas, they could swap their token for a toy to be gifted to somebody else; a friend, sibling, or family member. Parents were to be allowed in 15 minutes early to shop for their children first.

So, on Tuesday 2nd December, Christow School Council hosted their first **'Toy Swap'**. We were astounded by how many toys we unloaded from our only storage space in our small school; our school minibus! There were in excess of 200 toys and an equal number of books, filling our whole school hall. There was a buzz of excitement as children walked into a hall full of unseen toys and better still, knowing that these toys would be free, encouraged more families to turn up. Our PTFA kindly put on wonderful refreshments and a Christmas jumper swap, making this a real event. One parent remarked, 'I really hope that this takes away the stigma surrounding gifting secondhand items,' whilst another said, 'What a wonderful event. I hope it can be repeated next year. To top it all off, the leftover toys have now gone to Whipton Barton Junior School in Exeter to be used for their school attendance shop and Christmas fair. Ultimate waste management!

Our small but mighty Christow team certainly did their bit to raise the profile of waste management, support families with money saving opportunities and spread some Christmas joy in the process!





Become a School Governor

We are looking for **at least two new volunteers** to join our Local Governing Board (LGB). Your skills, experience, and perspective—whatever they may be—can make a real difference. Sharing the workload helps ensure our school continues to thrive.

Over the last decade, the role of a Governor has evolved, especially as more schools have joined Multi Academy Trusts. For Christow, this shift has been transformative. Fourteen years ago, our school faced significant challenges: fewer than 50 pupils, limited resources, and a leadership structure stretched thin as the Headteacher and Governing Board juggled finances, premises, and HR alongside teaching and learning.

By joining with Rydon and Teign School to form a Multi Academy Trust, Christow gained access to specialist support in finance, HR, and estates. This allowed staff and Governors to focus on what matters most—high-quality education.

Today, our school is stronger, our pupil numbers have doubled, and our staff benefit from being part of a thriving partnership of 14 schools.

Modern governance is now centred on supporting the day-to-day life of the school and championing the success and wellbeing of every child. This includes:

- Monitoring safeguarding and behaviour
- Taking an interest in the curriculum
- Understanding how we support pupils with SEND
- Monitoring staff and pupil wellbeing
- Celebrating achievements and progress
- Helping with staff recruitment

Governors attend **two meetings per term** (up to two hours each) and carry out some preparation between meetings. We currently meet on a Tuesday.

Visits to school during the day are also valuable for understanding practice first-hand.
