Achievement

• Pupils make excellent progress according to their ability; individual teaching, support and interventions enables all pupils to achieve according to their potential.

Quality of teaching

• The Quality of Teaching and Learning is outstanding - there is a broad programme of professional learning (need identified through effective performance management) which results in increased staff skill set. As a result pupils make excellent progress and develop good sporting skills, new experiences involving taking risks whilst keeping fit which in turn supports their mental health. E.G. Daniel, one of the pupils I interviewed spoke with great passion about how boxing had changed his whole attitude to life; he now aspires to join the army when he leaves school.
