This is a summary of how Abbey Park Primary School delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, extra-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

At Abbey Park Primary School the music curriculum covers the requirements of the EYFS Statutory Framework and the National Curriculum. It is in line with the model music curriculum and the government's vision to enable all children and young people in England to:

- learn to sing, play an instrument and create music together
- have the opportunity to progress their musical interests and talents, including professionally.

Our school curriculum for music is bespoke, based around the Get Set 4 Music Scheme, for Preschool to Year 7, which engages and inspires pupils to develop a love of music and develop their musical talent. It ensures that children have opportunities to listen to, perform and develop an appreciation for a wide range of music across diverse periods, genres, styles and traditions. It allows for practical opportunities to read, perform and compose different notes and rhythms.

We have enriched this curriculum from Early Years to Year 7 by offering all our children opportunities not only to play untuned percussion instruments, glockenspiels and keyboards but also to learn to play the ukulele in Year 4. Over the course of study, the children learn more complex melodies and rhythms that are sung and played. Some pupils who play other instruments bring these to music lessons and play these as part of the melodies all pupils are learning.

The school has a music room where music lessons can be taught. Individual instrumental lessons are taught by peripatetic teachers mainly from Severn Arts.

Music lessons are broken down into half-termly units and an emphasis is placed on progressive musical vocabulary, allowing children to talk about pieces of music using the correct terminology.

Each unit of work has an on-going musical learning focus and lessons follow a specific learning sequence:

Ready and Retrieval

Develop and Apply

Reflect and Review

The singing curriculum is supported by whole school singing, once a week for 15 minutes for lower and upper school. This is a combination of new songs and recapping previously taught ones. This allows the children to sing a wide range of songs as whole songs, rounds and in parts. The Young Voices Choir will sometimes perform in these sessions to the pupils and individuals perform solos.

Our focus on a 'Musician of the Month' introduces all pupils to a new artist and ensures an appreciation, understanding and love of a diverse range of music from great composers and musicians. Music is played to pupils from these musicians during music lessons and assemblies to support 'listen and appraise'. These musicians are chosen to celebrate diversity, representing a balance of gender, race, culture and those who have disabilities.

Part B: Extra-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

The pupils at Abbey Park Primary School have a wide range of choices when choosing an instrument to play outside of lesson time.

Individual lessons are taught by six peripatetic teachers, five of whom are provided by Severn Arts Music Service. There is a cost for these lessons. Instruments can be hired for free or purchased by parents/carers.

In addition, we partner with Rocksteady Music School to deliver fun and inclusive rock and pop band group lessons. These weekly music lessons take place in school led by a trained professional musician who knows how to inspire a love for music. The children learn new musical skills, make friends and have fun, all whilst boosting confidence, wellbeing, social skills and academic achievement. Rocksteady is delivered in partnership with Trinity College London through technology, where the band leader logs pupils skills in regular lessons. This means pupils continue to take part in their fun and progressive lessons, while working towards an Ofqual-regulated music qualification, without any need for exams or testing. There is a cost for these lessons. Instruments are hired for free.

Finally, a Young Voices choir runs bi-annually as a weekly extra-curricular club, leading up to the concert for pupils in Years 4 to Year 7. The choir is led by music teachers and focuses on performing at the Young Voices concert.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

At Abbey Park Primary School we see live musical events and experiences as important opportunities to celebrate music and musicianship and therefore ensure all pupils have as many opportunities as possible across their Abbey Park journey.
