Background:

Glossary

console	A piece of hardware used to play games both online and offline. Examples include XBOX, Playstation and various Nintendo devices.
copyright	Legal and personal permissions given by an individual or organisation for others to use their content e.g. pictures, videos, music
device	Items such as mobile phones, tablet computers, games consoles and laptops that have screens and are used to access the internet.
fair use	Where people can copy a very small amount of a work to use in reviews or in research reports
internet	The internet is a network, or system, that connects millions of computers worldwide.
Natterhub feed	This is the main page that all users within a class will be able to see. This is an area for pupils and teachers to share posts. These posts can then be viewed and commented on by all members of the class.
offline	When a computer or internet connected device is no longer connected to that service or network.
online	When you are working connected to the internet, usually via a website, or on devices such as computers, tablets and mobile phones.
open content	Content such as pictures, music, songs and more that are made and released for others to use without charge.
post	This is something which a user has shared on social media. It may be text they have written or something they have shared, such as a photo or a video. A post on Natterhub will be visible to all other users within the class.
social media	Online groups, chat rooms and sites where people can chat, share and interact with people all over the world.
upload	To move a photo, video or other file from the device where it is onto an online platform such as a storage folder, social media or website.
YouTube video	YouTube is a website that allows users to share and watch videos.
