

National Poetry Day Thursday 03 October 2024

For National Poetry Day this year Leverton will be having a multi-coloured non-uniform day! We would like you to wear as many colours as you can! To participate and come in wearing non-uniform, please could you bring in one or more books that you are happy to donate to the school for our annual book sale! There will also be a special poetry themed lunch available on the day.



Reading terminology

Phoneme - the smallest unit of sound in speech, made by 1 or more letters.

Grapheme - a written unit of sound, made by 1 or more letters.

Digraph - 2 letters that make 1 sound, e.g. 'ai' as in 'train'.

Trigraph - 3 letters that make one sound, e.g. 'igh' as in 'night'.

Split digraph - Where the 'e' in the word is silent and changes the vowel sound, so that instead of saying the letter sound - it says the letter name. For example, 'i-e' as in 'slide'.

Pseudo words - these are decodable words, but not real words in English. For example, 'whape' or 'stroft'.

Harder to read and spell words - common words that can't be sounded out using basic phonics - including many of the most useful words in English, such as 'the', 'was', 'one', 'were', 'their', etc.

Echo reading - The adult reads first, then the child reads it, exactly as the adult read it.

Choral reading - This follows echo reading where both the adult and child read at the same time.

Finger tracking - This is where an adult or the child places their finger <u>above</u> the words as they read, so that the reader can process the lines of text below.

Idiom - A group of words or a phrase that don't necessarily mean what you want to say. For example, 'Once in a blue moon'.



Build

Ask your child to predict what they think is going to

happen next.

Build reading together into your daily routine.

Find a quiet, comfortable place to read together away from any distractions.

ASS

Ask about their opinion of the book. Discuss story, style likes and dislikes.

Reading at Home

With Your Child

If it is the same book, ask your child to recap what has happaned so far.

If it is a new book, start by looking at the

cover, title, pictures

and blurb.

Connect

Try to connect the story to your child's own world.

Check their understanding of the book. Ask questions -Why..? How..? Who..? When..? Where..? What..?

If your child mispronounces a word, do not interrupt. Allow them time to selfcorrect. Discuss and research the meaning of any unfamiliar words or phrases.
