Dear Parent/Carer,

The snow was a surprise this week and we were unable to open due to insufficient staff being able to reach the school to provide the correct child:adult ratio and due to the school site being unsafe following a risk assessment.

Next week we will face further challenges as there are another two National Education Union strike action days on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> March and Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March. I will inform you again in the morning before 07:30 on each day regarding which year groups or children the school will be open to. Following union and government guidance I am unable to redeploy teachers to cover for striking colleagues or require teachers to provide home learning or prepare lessons for a colleague's class. I apologise in advance for the inconvenience school closures are causing.

We met a new colleague this week – Bobby – a four-legged friend! Bobby, a Labrador, is a registered, temperament-tested pet. He has had health, temperament, suitability and stability examinations through the Pets As Therapy (PAT) charity to be able to support in our school. He is supported by his owner Chryssie Green who is a PAT volunteer. Bobby's primary role at our school is to help children build confidence in reading and he has already made a fine start! Eight children each half term will have the opportunity to read with Bobby and we hope that we can continue to provide more children with this opportunity each term. We will always ask for parental/carer permission if we can offer your child an opportunity to read with Bobby.

We had a school property meeting this week with Hampshire County Council (HCC) and we are delighted that at the end of April 2023 all the school window frames and external painted walls will be receiving a fresh coat of paint which is paid for by HCC. This will help to smarten the school exterior later in the year.

Congratulations to Adriel, Mia, Eden and Kyan who will receive a book prize for winning the World Book Day Story Jar competition. Although we send special congratulations to these four children, we also congratulate all children that made an entry. We were so impressed with the efforts that had been put in to each jar and thank you for supporting your child with this.

Today we began British Science Week – see further details below. Mrs Taylor (our Science Lead) has organised some live lessons next week, virtually hosted by NFU education linking to farming. Mrs Taylor also spoke to the children in Collective Worship today about the British Science Week poster competition linked to the theme, 'Connections'.
