

<p><u>Physical Development</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cutting different fruit- eating fruit with a knife and fork. • Making shapes – straight, tuck, straddle, star, pike – on the floor, on apparatus, when jumping • Rocking and Rolling • Using clay tools and peelers safely. • Manipulating playdough to make the animals • Peeling different fruits – what happens and why? 		<p><u>Mathematics</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Counting out amounts, matching and learning the numerals 9 and 10. • Comparing numbers to 10, more than, fewer than, equal amounts. • Doubles – 6 is made of 3 and 3 etc • Odd Blocks and Even Tops – odd and even numbers • Composition of 7, 8,9,10 as 5 and 2, 5 and 3 etc • 3D Shapes • Height - tall/short, taller/shorter • Reciting numbers to 30 – focus on saying four-teen, six-teen etc
<p><u>Communication and Language</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tales Toolkit Story language – character, setting, problem, solution • Talking about the African animals – what do the children know about them? Names of the animals. Other African animals. • Act out stories using Tales Toolkit toys • To describe the different landscapes in Africa • Adjectives describing the fruit. 	<p><u>Enrichment Activities</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Making bread rolls • Growing a cress mountain • Tasting different fruits • Celebrating Easter- egg rolling/hunts • Assembly for parents/carers 	<p><u>Understanding the World</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Celebrating different festivals: Easter Story & Traditions • Compare locations - Africa to our country. • Looking at early Spring and the changes that are happening outside – daffodils, tulips etc growing in our garden. Buds on trees. • To investigate how to make a dough ball – using flour and water. • Making their own bread roll and talk how it changes • Making toast – what happens to the bread in the toaster. • Growing cress heads • Sketching spring flowers

- Keeping safe when out and about – what would you do if you got lost. Stranger Danger.


Key Vocabulary

Animal name – animals from the story and other safari animals eg antelope, ostrich, gazelle, wildebeest, cheetah, warthog, hyena etc Adjectives to describe the skin of fruits: rough, smooth, bumpy Words to describe the taste/texture of fruits: creamy, sweet, sour, tart, juicy, slimy, crunchy Words associated with cooking - bake, ingredients, recipe, equipment, dough, kneading, rolling 		<p><u>Activities I can do at home.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Practice using a knife and fork to eat – cutting own food up When shopping look at different fruits – try something new! Go on an “signs of spring” walk – look for spring flowers or buds A trip to the zoo or the safari park. Drawing/painting pictures of their favourite African animal. To make toast and butter it. To make their favourite sandwich.
