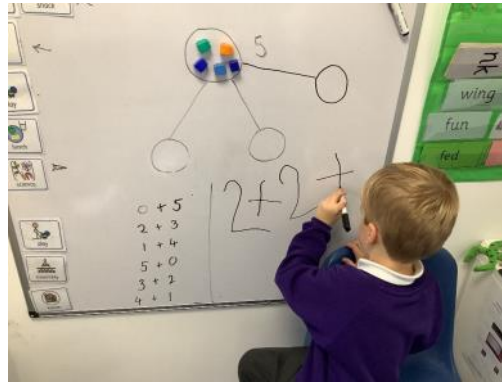

Super Mathematicians

In our maths, we have been continuing with the theme of 'numbers are made up of smaller numbers' and we have been learning how to use a 'part-part whole model' to show this.

Today we used unifix cubes to help us find lots of different ways to make 5 and show this on the part-part whole model.

The 'extra spicy' challenge was to use a part-part-part whole model to make 5!



Autumn Parent Survey 2025



1. Strong confidence in school leadership

Q9 received the **highest score in the entire survey** showing that parents overwhelmingly feel the school is **well led and managed**.

2. Behaviour recognised as a growing strength

Q7 ("This school makes sure its pupils are well behaved") showed the **biggest improvement** from the previous survey.

3. Parents feel their children are well cared for

Q4 ("My child is well looked after at this school") remained one of the highest-rated areas reflecting continued confidence in the school's pastoral care.

What Parents Said	Actions Taken by the School
More menu variety needed; bring back jacket potatoes; portions sometimes small.	Jacket potatoes added back to the menu; portion sizes and future menu variety being reviewed.
Would like more regular information about what children are learning.	Curriculum maps and Knowledge Organisers shared with parents at the start of each half term.
Requests for a platform to share learning and communicate more effectively after children leave reception.	Exploring an online platform to share learning (planned for January 2026).
Requests for more sports opportunities and consistent PE.	Working with the School Sports Partnership to provide additional sports opportunities as well as delivering 2.5 hours of PE learning a week.
Concerns about class size increases and pressures on staff.	Ongoing staffing review and strengthened communication (in progress).
More feedback about children's progress, especially early in the year.	Curriculum maps shared. Parent Meetings to be moved early in the Autumn term next year. Regular meet the teacher events/ Open Classrooms to be reinstated.
Clarity about changes, routines and expectations.	Implementing clearer whole-school communication systems.
Concerns about informal communication routes (e.g. WhatsApp).	School reinforcing that formal communication will come via official channels.
SEND support concerns.	SEND provision under review with strengthened communication.

Become a School Governor

We are looking for **at least two new volunteers** to join our Local Governing Board (LGB). Your skills, experience, and perspective—whatever they may be—can make a real difference. Sharing the workload helps ensure our school continues to thrive.

Over the last decade, the role of a Governor has evolved, especially as more schools have joined Multi Academy Trusts. For Christow, this shift has been transformative. Fourteen years ago, our school faced significant challenges: fewer than 50 pupils, limited resources, and a leadership structure stretched thin as the Headteacher and Governing Board juggled finances, premises, and HR alongside teaching and learning.

By joining with Rydon and Teign School to form a Multi Academy Trust, Christow gained access to specialist support in finance, HR, and estates. This allowed staff and Governors to focus on what matters most—high-quality education.

Today, our school is stronger, our pupil numbers have doubled, and our staff benefit from being part of a thriving partnership of 14 schools.

Modern governance is now centred on supporting the day-to-day life of the school and championing the success and wellbeing of every child. This includes:

- Monitoring safeguarding and behaviour
- Taking an interest in the curriculum
- Understanding how we support pupils with SEND
- Monitoring staff and pupil wellbeing
- Celebrating achievements and progress
- Helping with staff recruitment

Governors attend **two meetings per term** (up to two hours each) and carry out some preparation between meetings. We currently meet on a Tuesday.

Visits to school during the day are also valuable for understanding practice first-hand.
