Key Word	Definition
Monotype	A unique print made by applying paint or printing ink to glass, metal or plastic.
Installation	Putting something inside something else - 3D.
Evoke	Bring or recall something into the mind.
Response	Verbal or written answer or reaction.
Mood	Messages and ideas created in a piece of art.
Layer	Overlapping materials such as paint, to give depth.
Combine	Bring together different things.
Multi-media	Artworks made from a range of materials.
Foreground	The closest object.
Background	The furthest object.
Articulate	Jointed or divided into joints.
Similarities	Characteristics in common.
Differences	Not the same as another.

Learning Sequence

1

Understand how monotype is used by Kervork Mourad.

2

Create a lexicon of marks by varying the tool, hold, pressure, speed and intention of the way the mark is made.

3

Use colour mixing and paint to create an effect. Introduce Poem. Create backgrounds and papers for collage.

4

Create foreground images using collage.

5

Use monoprint to add detail and text to a collage.

6

Complete artwork. Share, review and reflect on artwork.
