In their maths sessions the Y1 children have started to look at shapes - 3D shape names and their properties. The Reception children are consolidating the make-up of 4 and 5. The class have worked brilliantly in collaborative groups. The older children showed real leadership by supporting the younger pupils in their oracy, which will be used to support their writing next week. The whole class have shown how confident they are by performing their



poems in front of each other, in preparation for the Twilight Carol Concert. It is not to be underestimated how challenging standing up in front of your peers can be, so really well done Hazel class! In maths, the children have been using dienes and place value charts to demonstrate their understanding of exchanging in addition and subtraction, as well as learning different mental methods for calculating. The highlight of the week was definitely the amazing nature-makes workshop, where the children created some incredible artwork. A huge thank you to the PTA for organising this and to Naomi for her patience and creativity. What a brilliant morning!

#### Willow

Willow Class have enjoyed another very busy and productive week! Alongside completing a range of assessments, the children have shown real maturity, focus and determination—they should be extremely proud of themselves. Our rehearsals have also continued, and it has been wonderful to see the children supporting one another, remembering lines, singing enthusiastically and showing real confidence on stage. Their teamwork has really shone through.

We also spent time creating some beautiful 3D snowflakes. The care and concentration that went into these was excellent—children followed each step of the instructions carefully, demonstrated great perseverance and produced some stunning results. They are now proudly displayed in the classroom and have added a real festive feel.





#### Simple ways to enjoy the festive season without overspending

Christmas can be a great time to relax and spend time with family, but it often comes with extra costs and pressure to spend more than we'd like. With household budgets already stretched, a bit of planning can make a real difference.

#### 1. Set a Realistic Budget

Work out what you can comfortably afford to spend and stick to it. It's easy for small extras to add up, so keep a list of what you need — and what you don't. If you can, set aside a small amount each week to spread the cost.

#### 2. Keep Gifts Simple

Children often remember the fun and attention more than what's under the tree. Lowcost or homemade <u>gifts</u>, <u>or</u> pooling together for a "Secret Santa" within the family, can keep things fair and affordable for everyone.

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#### Should I keep my

# child off school?

### Yes

#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
