


In my WRITING...

I can add the suffixes -ed, -ing, -er, -est to root words.


I can use the prefix un-.

Superstar Spellers




I can understand which letters belong to which handwriting "families" and practice these.

I can use a simple structure in my writing (e.g. beginning, middle and end or instructions written in the right order).


I can talk to my teacher and my friends about what I have written.

I use capital letters for the names of people, places, days and the pronoun 'I'.

I am beginning to punctuate sentences using capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks.
