It has been a great week here at Stoke Fleming Primary School. I have been fortunate to spend a significant amount of time in classrooms, seeing first-hand the fantastic learning taking place across the school. I have also enjoyed seeing many of you at drop-off each morning. Whenever possible, I try to be outside to welcome you all into school—rain or shine! While this is an important part of building strong relationships, it is also a valuable opportunity for you to speak to me about anything I may be able to help with. Whilst I may not always have the answer straight away, I will always do my very best to find out and get back to you—so please do feel free to stop and speak to me; that's what I'm there for.

Alongside this, I have spent time looking at pupils' books from every class and across a range of subjects. I have been incredibly impressed by both the quality and quantity of work. It is clear to see just how hard our children are working each day. I have had the pleasure of reading some fantastic stories and well-constructed non-chronological reports, which really showcase the progress being made.

This work has formed part of our ongoing review of our marking and feedback policy. Our focus remains on ensuring that children receive clear, purposeful feedback that helps them to improve their work further. We are also placing a strong emphasis on securing key foundational skills, such as accurate letter and number formation, as well as the correct use of capital letters and full stops.

It is very encouraging to see the positive impact this is having. The improvements in presentation, accuracy and overall quality of work are clear, and this is something we will continue to build on as we strive for the very best outcomes for all of our children.

The highlight of the week for me was spending some time down at Forest School with our children in Little Lanterns. It is such a fantastic space that we are so fortunate to have, and one that all of our children are able to enjoy on a weekly basis. It was wonderful to see the curiosity and excitement on the children's faces as they explored and engaged with the environment.

Hope you all have a fantastic weekend!


