Parent Hub



- This is how we communicate with you about what is happening in school
- Download the Parent Hub app from your app store (iPhone or Android). The Parent Hub app is FREE to download and use which means the School saves money communicating with you about your child and what is happening in school.
- Create yourself an account.
- Choose “Add a School” and enter the school handle - **@KingsRoadCPS**
- You will then be taken through a process to match you with your child so you can follow the correct channels relevant to your child. The channels you will need to be following are; Kings Road Primary School, your child’s year group and your child’s class. You will be asked for your child’s DOB and you will need to give your contact telephone number. These must match what we have on our system.

School dinners

- From next week your children will have to have a booked meal like the rest of the school.
- Activation codes have been given out via your child for www.myevolvehub.com
- Head to www.myevolvehub.com to create your account. Once created you go to 'permissions' and enter your activation code which will create an icon for your child. You can then get started on ordering meals



Online Meal Ordering



How Does it Work?

- You can order meals in advance online via your PC, Tablet or Smart Phone at your convenience
- You can maintain your child's allergen information and dietary needs directly on-line to ensure accuracy
- Meal orders are securely passed to the School's kitchen and office systems.
- All Reception children are entitled to Free School Meals so all you need to do is process the order

What Are the Benefits?

- Your child receives the meal of your choice
- Food waste is minimised and costs reduced
- Menu choices are restricted according to your child's individual dietary needs:-

Menus are managed in relation to the 14 National Allergens, Vegetarian, Vegan, Halal, Kosher, and Meat Species – beef, pork, poultry, lamb and fish. (Other allergens can be managed by application only – or as advisory flag to kitchen staff only)



However, we need you to do the following:

- The cut off date for orders is the Wednesday before the following week of service. By Wednesday of every week all orders for the following weeks meals must be made. Block half termly or termly bookings can be made
- If your child is absent on the day, please cancel the meal(s) ordered for the term of the absence (by 10am on morning of service). You must access your account to do this as the office are unable to cancel meals
- If your child is going on a school trip and you require a school packed lunch, this must be ordered in advance also. Similarly, if you choose to give your child a packed lunch from home, any lunch order for the date of the trip must be cancelled
- Please advise ASAP if your child changes from school meals to sandwiches (or vice versa). Be aware that charges will be incurred by school every day that a child is recorded as a diner.



How does this help?

- Supplies are ordered in advance, and having meal orders in advance ensures we order as accurately as possible, minimising waste
- The more parents co-operate, the more school saves money on catering

Thus there is more money left to spend in school on the education of your children



School milk

- When a child turns 5 years old there is a charge for milk.
- Children do not have to have milk however parents/ carers will be have to pay before any milk will be given.
- All children under 5 are entitled to free milk but parents will need to sign up with cool milk to make sure their child receives this.



Pupil Premium

- Funding provided to school to enhance opportunities for children.
- Based on earned income.
- If you are in receipt of benefits school could receive additional funding for your child. Please complete the School's Free School Meal / Pupil Premium form which can be obtained from the School Office. This process will then be completed on your behalf and you will be notified of the outcome
