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Dear Parents/ Carers,

On Wednesday, we were delighted to welcome Alice from Dartmouth Library, who came to share a selection of stories with Class Compass and Little Lanterns. The children were completely absorbed—listening carefully, joining in with repeated phrases, making predictions about what might happen next and eagerly talking about their favourite characters and moments. There was lots of laughter, curiosity and thoughtful discussion, and it was a real joy to see just how engaged they were throughout the sessions.

Instilling a love of reading and books is one of our highest priorities here at Stoke Fleming. Sharing and talking about books and stories we enjoy helps children to develop language, imagination and confidence, as well as a lifelong enjoyment of reading. This is just as important at home as it is in school. From sharing bedtime stories with our youngest children to discussing books, articles or newspapers with our older pupils, these shared moments play a powerful role in shaping positive reading habits.

Lost Property

Back in September, Mrs Callard ordered a new storage box for lost property. At the time, I thought there was no way we would need such a large box—however, I have since been proven very wrong! It is now completely full to the brim. Unfortunately, the majority of items have no names or labels, which makes it impossible for us to return them to their rightful owners.

If your child is missing a jumper, coat or any other item, please do come and have a look. A gentle plea to ensure that all items of clothing are clearly named so they can be safely returned if they become misplaced. When it eventually stops raining, I will also put the uniform out on a table at pick-up time to make it easier for you to check.

Attendance

Thank you for all your continued efforts to maximise children's attendance. We know that good attendance has a significant impact on learning. For example:

- Missing just one day every fortnight adds up to around 20 days of school a year, which is roughly the same as missing a whole month of learning.
- An attendance of 90%, while sounding high, actually means a child is missing the equivalent of one day every two weeks.

Over time, these small gaps can make a big difference, and we are committed to working together to support every child's attendance. Did you know that each week we award house points to the house with the best attendance? The competition is already heating up!

Please also be aware that any parent taking their child on an unauthorised holiday of five or more days will receive a penalty notice. Further information can be found here: [School absence penalty notices - Children, families and education](#)

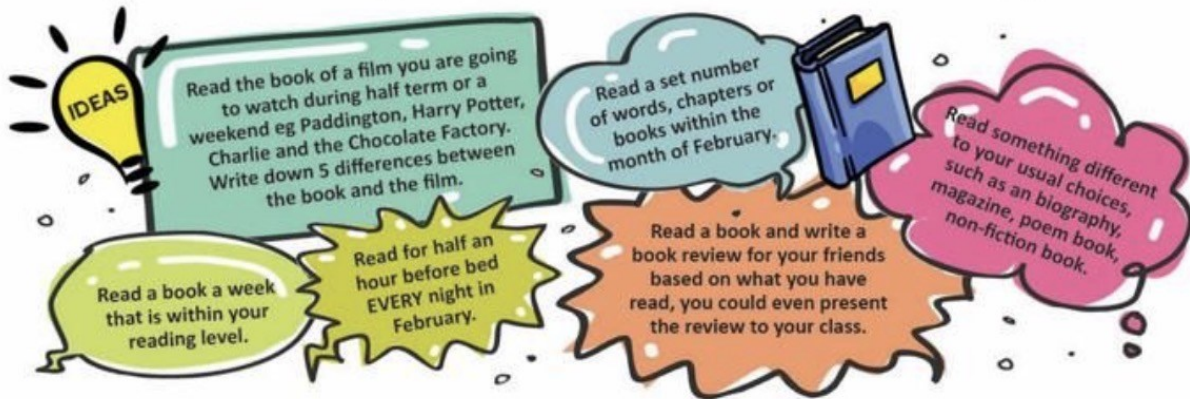
