








School Attendance - Ongoing Reporting

The information below shows that whole school attendance for the dates between 6th September 2021 and 23rd June 2022 is currently **91.7%**, static from when we reported 1 week ago.



This is still below the expected attendance rate of **96% or higher.** The national average for attendance in state funded primary schools was **92.3%** to April 2022, Wynstream Primary School is **0.6%** below this national average.

Chickenpox in school. We do have some reported cases of Chickenpox in school, and affected classes have received letters home with advice and guidance. We would like to share the NHS link to help our families access information should your child present with a rash. Click here to be taken to the NHS website. Please call the school office on the first day of absence and we can advise you on when your child can return to school.



Current government guidance suggests that Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.

Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under who have a positive COVID 19 test the advice will be 3 days.






