We are excited about sporting events at Kings Road this term and felt it might be a good time to explain why we do what we do.

Mr Conley works very hard to arrange wonderful activities for all pupils, which we invite parents to watch if they wish. The aim for this event is fun and participation. They are great events with a lovely atmosphere. Unfortunately, due to the size of the school we can't allow parents to join their children and insist that adults stay behind the cordon. We would love to allow parents to meander during the day, but we cannot do this due to risk to children.

This term we also hold the Kings Road Olympics. These are inclusive and competitive events. All children across the school are expected to participate. All children in Nursery sprint 30m, throw a bean bag and complete a standing long jump. We award the winners. More events are added until children in Y6 are expected to sprint 90m, run 4 times around the field, throw a beanbag and javelin and compete in a standing long jump. It is disheartening to see how many children are unable to run this reasonably short distance.

The three winners from each year group get a medal, with the running events being decided at Longford Park Athletics Stadium on Wednesday 2nd July. The winners of the running events will then represent Kings Road at the Stretford Olympics (which we also organise) on 7th July.
