To know the days of the week and months of the year

By the end of this half term, you should know the following facts. The aim is to recall these facts **instantly**. You should also be familiar with using the key vocabulary.

Monday	January	August
Tuesday	February	September
Wednesday	March	October
Thursday	April	November
Friday	May	December
Saturday	June	
Sunday	July	

You should be able to recall these in order as well as answer questions such as ‘What day comes after...’ or ‘Which month is before...?’

Top Tips!

- Practise little and often. Use your time wisely – could you practise on the way to school or while waiting in a queue at the supermarket?
- Talk about what day of the week or month of the year it is and discuss key dates such as holidays that occur in each month.
- Make a poster – either keep this sheet displayed somewhere where you will see it daily, or even better, make your own colourful poster of the facts for your bedroom wall or to go on the fridge.
- Have your own calendar on display that you update daily. Talk about what day it is tomorrow, or how many days until Saturday.
- Revisit – You may think you know your target facts after one week, but if you don’t practise regularly, you’ll soon forget! Keep revisiting old facts regularly to keep them locked in your head!
