Fred Talk Routine



1. Say the word in sounds e.g. c-a-t.
2. Ask the child to repeat.

Can they 'jump-in' with the whole word?

3. Say the word in sounds followed by the whole word e.g. c-a-t, cat.
4. Ask the child to repeat.





"Snatchosaurus is a very dangerous dinosaur," she said.



"So it's obvious! We need to find an even more dangerous dinosaur to catch him!"

"But where can we find a dinosaur like that?" asked Stegosaurus, cautiously.


"We will make one!" came the reply.
