The Bayeux Tapestry is 956 years old and was thought to be sewn by women in Canterbury in 1070. It depicts the story of William the Conqueror, the king of France and his defeat of King Harold the English King in the Battle of Hastings in 1066. The tapestry has arrived back in England for a visit from the French town of Bayeux and can be seen at the British museum. It made the perfect assembly today for years 5 and 6 and is a vital piece of historic information, that every English citizen should know.
