### **Year 6 Visit to Churchill War Rooms**

On Monday, Year 6 visited the Churchill War Rooms as part of their World War II topic. The children were fascinated to explore the underground headquarters where Winston Churchill and his team planned Britain's wartime strategy. They had the chance to step back in time and see the rooms exactly as they were left in 1945, including Churchill's bedroom and the Cabinet Room.

The visit really brought their learning to life and helped the children understand what life was like during the war. They particularly enjoyed the interactive exhibits and discovering more about Churchill's leadership and determination. #### Lateness

Please can everyone make a real effort to be in school and on time every day. School dates open at 8.45am and are closed at 8.55am each day. Anyone arriving after this time is late and is missing out on valuable learning time. Registers are taken at 9.00am, children who arrive after this are late. Registers close at 9.15am. Any arrival after this is an unauthorised absence. For any children arriving after the gates are closed, parents will need to come into Reception and sign the late book, giving a reason for lateness. Persistent latecomers will be asked to meet with the headteacher so that we can work in partnership to ensure that children are brought to school on time and not missing out on vital learning time. Every minute in school counts, lateness equals lost learning opportunities - 10 minutes late each day is 6.5 days lost! 15 minutes late each day is 10 days lost! 20 minutes late each day is 13 days lost! 30 minutes late each day is 19 days lost!
