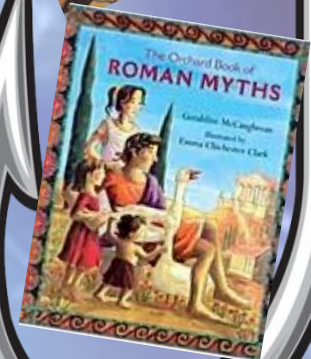
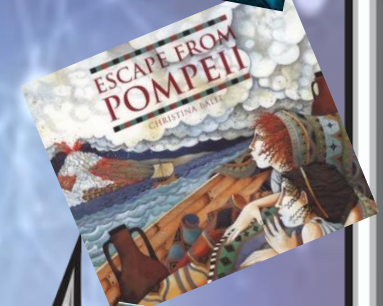
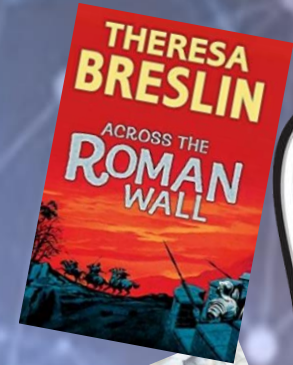
The Roman conquest of Britain began in 43AD and they withdrew around 410AD.
