
If you have a concern over 'admin' matters e.g. dinner money, trip money, lost items etc. these should be communicated to the school office not the class teachers.

Issues or concerns regarding in class activities or learning should be communicated to the class teachers. This can be in person or via Weduc. If you wish to speak to a teacher at length please come to the office to book an appointment. The appointment will usually be for the same day. It is very difficult for teachers to speak at the beginning or at pick up time as they are supervising children.

If you wish to speak to a member of the leadership team, having spoken to the class teacher, then an appointment can be made at the school office between 8.15am and 4.15pm.

### **Behaviour at Hugglescote**

#### Parent / carer forum

#### **Attendance support**

All children are expected to have an attendance of 97% or higher. **Very well done** to all children above this percentage and especially those at 100%. Keep it up!

The Government changed the attendance guidance last year. The fines for penalty notices have been increased and the amount of unauthorised absence allowed before a penalty is issued has been decreased. Penalty notices are issued by the local authority, not the school.

Currently any child with 10 sessions (1 day = 2 sessions) unauthorised absences in a 10 week period is deemed 'at risk' and support will be offered. Any unauthorised holiday absence of five days or more will have a penalty notice issued. The fine has increased to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days. If a second notice is issued in a 3 year period this increases to £160 per child per parent.

Please remember that lates after the registers have closed are an unauthorised absence.
