LKS2 PSHE and Citizenship Relationships - TEAM

Guide for Parents and Carers

This term, your child's PSHE and Citizenship topic is TEAM.

This unit entitled TEAM (Together Everyone Achieves More) will focus on new starts, teamwork behaviours and conflict resolution. It will initially look at the feelings, concerns and resolutions for new starts by focusing on the new start children face when they return to school, start a new class, school or year group. The unit will then look at team behaviours, resolving things when they go wrong and the responsibilities individuals have within a team.

We will be exploring these questions:

- **Lesson 1:** How does it feel to start a new class? What are we looking forward to? Is there anything we will miss?
- **Lesson 2:** What are the features of a good team? How do team members benefit from being in a team?
- **Lesson 3:** How do the actions of our teammates affect us? How is our team affected by our actions?
- **Lesson 4:** How can we tell what our teammates are feeling? How can we respond to the feelings of other people?
- **Lesson 5:** What happens when we fall out with our team members? How can we solve these problems?
- **Lesson 6:** Why is it important that everyone on a team fulfils their responsibilities? What are our responsibilities towards our team?

Your child will be taking part in a range of activities, including the following:

Participating in drama, solving clues as a team, describing a change that has happened, identifying feelings within body language, facial expression and words, resolving dispute scenarios with pictures and creating good deed ideas.

PSHE and Citizenship education stands for Personal, Social, Health and Economic education. It is an important part of the school curriculum that aims to teach children the knowledge and skills that they need to stay safe, happy and healthy, while preparing them for their life ahead.
