Thinking ahead to Sports day, yet another reminder (this is the same information as before so feel free to skip over if you know what is happening, new information and reminders are in blue

Just to think ahead to Sports Day which will be held on the first Thursday after May half term **Thursday 9 June**, we would love parents to attend this year.

We would like <u>parent volunteers</u> to help with time events in the morning, this is very easy, you can sit down and the children will come to you and all you need to do is record what they do with a stop watch, no sporting skills are required, just patience!

Please let us know if you can help from 9-12, we will provide you with coffees and teas, you will need a sunhat as its very exposed on the field, maybe two of you could share the morning between you? We need 10 helpers in total.

For those of you who have not experienced sports day yet we also love parents to come to school at 12 noon and bring a picnic to eat with your child, or alternatively we do a hot dog and chips dinner for the children to eat outside which you can buy too, there will be a letter about this very soon for ordering.

Parents are able to sit on the slope and school aged children sit on the opposite side of the track under gazebos so everyone has a good view, please bring a rug or a deck chair to sit on

Please keep Toddlers off the track and please do not beckon your child over to you once races start, you will be able to have them back for ice creams after we have presented the cup at the end of the afternoon

The PTFA run teas and coffees all afternoon and after sports day we have ice creams and lollies for sale. The children will run races from 12.45 pm prompt all afternoon having done team activities all morning. We finish the afternoon by presenting the trophy to the winning team who do a lap of the field in honour of their win then have their photo taken.

- 2. You might like to make sure you get the day off work from 12 noon to come along, if wet we move it on one week until we get a dry day. Races will start promptly at 12.45.
- Think about whether you could commit to helping in the morning, parents who have done it before do find it enjoyable and offer to help in subsequent years.
- 4. Bring a deck chair or a rug to sit on and consider whether you would like to order a school outside lunch or bring a picnic.
- 5. Bring some money for teas and coffees and an ice cream for you and or your child afterwards!
- 6. Bring your best cheering voice and a camera to support your child's team!
- 7. All children take part in all activities all morning and then run at least one race plus the class novelty races in the afternoon so it's great for self-esteem and gives children the chance to shine! We value all children contributions and they all add up to the overall scores.
- 8. One word of warning, there is a toddler's race and a mums/ dads race too at the end! If time allows.

We will be moving in line with popular demand to <u>streamlining our communications</u> with you and as such we will be ceasing the use of text messaging other than through the WEDUC APP. Please make sure that you download this, as this will become our main communication with you for speedy purposes as well as email.

- 1. Telephone for emergency and short notice communication to make sure we see or hear it.
- 2. Email to head or admin or class teachers as we are always checking these too.
- 3. Face to face of course is the easiest of all either before or after school at the gate nd door or if preferred by ringing school to make an appointment, we will always go out of our way to see you the same day or very soon afterwards.
- 4. Texting will be phased out and we will send messages through the APP, there will be a red marker on the APP if there is a notice or a news update
