Top Tips for Staying Safe:

- Be Bright, Be Seen: Wear bright or reflective clothing and consider adding reflective strips to coats and bags.

● Use Safe Crossing Points: Always use pedestrian crossings or traffic lights where possible.

● Stay Alert: Avoid distractions like headphones or mobile phones when near roads.

● Hold Hands: Younger children should always hold an adult's hand when crossing.

Most children have the nasal spray vaccine which is the preferred vaccine. A vaccine injection is also available which does not contain gelatine from pigs (porcine gelatine).
