
#### EYFS recommendation:






- Browse 'Kindle Daily Deals' for cheap (and free) books to read on the free Kindle app.








We held a book swap. Everyone had the opportunity to bring in a book that they would like to donate. In return, they were able to pick a different book from the donations.







2024 is the Year of the Dragon according to the Chinese zodiac. So here are our favourite books with dragons in them.







