Dear families,



We have had a lovely term, it's been very busy with pantomimes, Christmas Fayres, Christmas jumpers and a whole host of other exciting events!

Earlier this term we had an ESW trust review where senior ESW staff and external providers visited the school over two days to look at lessons, speak to students and staff and meet with leaders. We had very positive feedback around curriculum development, the quality of teaching and positive school culture. There was also a Governor Engagement Day on Friday 15 November where members of the governing body spent the day in school looking at key themes around curriculum, teaching, inclusion and culture. We also received positive feedback from this, specifically around positive attitudes to learning and behaviour in lessons and around the school site. The "Warm, strict" approach we have been working on in school is having an impact in terms of positive relationships between staff and students and an increase in praise points and rewards. There has also been a significant decrease in behaviour points and suspensions.

Year 11s sat their PPE exams (mock GCSEs) and received their grades, which were the highest we have ever had at this point. They are an incredible year group and have been working extremely hard in lessons and when revising at home. We are so proud of their attitude and the effort they are putting in; their future looks very bright!

Students have been thriving with all our extracurricular activities such as sports clubs, performing and creative arts events and charity work. The summer enrichment week offer will be going out to parents shortly. This includes a residential adventure trip for Year 7, and a range of residential and day trips for year 8 and 9. There will also be daily events back at school for those students who chose to stay with us for the week. Please sign up to these early to avoid any disappointment.

Leaders have been working on mapping out our "11 by 11" provision. The aim is that all of our young people have accessed at least 11 key areas of enrichment by the time they leave Year 11. This includes things like leadership opportunities, community work, careers advice and work experience, etc. These are activities and events all students will encounter as part of their universal provision. For example; years 7 to 10 all had a session with the BBC this term looking at and discussing careers in the South West and every tutor group put a Christmas food hamper together to support a local food bank and families who are struggling at this time of the year. In addition our students all participated in our moving Remembrance service on 11 November where a Navy veteran spoke to them about his first-hand experiences of war. All these events and activities help to develop a young person's character and enable them to have a rounded understanding of the world around them.



#### **CHILDREN IN NEED - MASTERMIND**

On Friday 15 November, students and staff at Coombeshead Academy got involved with fundraising for the annual Children In Need appeal.

Teachers were put in the hot seat as they took part in a 'Mastermind' challenge in the school theatre, answering questions on a topic of their choice to raise money. 'Mastermind' is one of the UK's longest-running quiz shows. With its iconic, ominous black chair, contestants face a series of challenging questions, interrogation-style.

Question master extraordinaire Mr Graham fired a series of tricky questions for 2 minutes to each of the contestants: Ms Stewart, Ms Williams, Ms Chappell, Mr Stevenson, Dr Hockley-Still and Mr Doxford. Topics included traditional British foods, kings and queens of England, U2, Exeter City FC, history of the Premier League and Harry Potter With an encyclopaedic knowledge of Exeter City FC and scoring an impressive 18 points - Dr Hockley-Still came out as the undisputed champion!

Thanks to the generosity of the donations, we raised a grand total of £74.30. A huge thank you to all who took part!



#### REMEMBRANCE DAY SERVICE

On Monday 11 November, all staff and students gathered for our annual service of remembrance. The service was led by Mrs Coulson who spoke of the sacrifice made by others during times of military conflict. Our guests were Mr and Mrs Kevin Adamson. Kevin is the chairman of the Royal Naval Association in Plymouth and himself saw active service in the Royal Navy. He spoke about the significance and importance of Remembrance Day for veterans. The whole school fell silent for 2 minutes and we were joined by long time supporter of the school, Mr Mike Brewer who played the Last Post. The students were an absolute credit throughout.



#### **REMEMBRANCE - CREATIVE ARTS**

Prior to Remembrance Day Coombeshead students worked with Devon based sculptor Alistair Lambert, in sessions funded through Daisi by The Helen Foundation, to create a large commemorative World War One sculpture. The sculpture is now hanging in the new gallery stairwell in the CREATE department at the school.

Initially students conducted research and created drawings focusing on World War One aviation. The students made the most of Alistair's knowledge and got stuck in with the workshop, producing some great sculptures, while also learning more about our history at the same time.

As part of the installation and part of the school's Remembrance Day preparations, staff and students from all year groups have made hundreds of 3D paper poppies to hang in the windows of the Create gallery.

#### POLICE TRAINING VIDEO - YOUNG DEVON

Last year some year 9 Diversity Ambassadors took part in the peer research project 'Safer spaces, safer places' with the charity Young Devon, which was about making our local area safer and more inclusive for young people. Initially some of the students expressed their concerns about the perception of young people in the community (misconceptions/stereotypes) and their experience with the police being quite negative at times.

Consequently the same group of students (now in Year 10) have been involved in another collaborative workshop this term. This time they've been invited to script a video based around police officers learning how young people perceive them and how the trust and cooperation can be built.

Becca Hewitt (Community Safety and Safeguarding Manager for Teignbridge District Council) attended the latest session when the video was filmed in school by a professional videographer with students directing, narrating and acting very skillfully. Becca commended our students for the positive impact that their contributions will have on local police training.

Students took part in 4 x 1 hour sessions, led by BBC Talk Sport presenter Steve Forbes, who introduced three professionals in a 'panel-style' setup. We were joined by Harry Moreton, Charity Development officer at Exeter City Football Club, Daniel Willers, Creative Director at Yellow Mouse Studios in Exeter and Yolanda Bekker Colman, Resource Scheduler at BBC Plymouth. Each of the guests talked about their career pathway and covered a variety of topics, such as relevant qualifications, personal anecdotes, advice on work experience and key soft skills for the workplace. Students were given the opportunity to ask lots of questions at the end of each of the sessions.

The Bitesize Careers Tour aims to focus on careers in a variety of sectors and has hopefully helped to inspire students about opportunities that exist on their doorstep. The aim of the Bitesize Careers Tour is to raise awareness of career aspirations to secondary pupils across the UK and give them practical advice on how they can pursue a career in a variety of settings.





#### **CAREERS FAIR 2024**

On Thursday 5 December Coombeshead Academy hosted its annual careers fair. For the first time, this was held during the school day and meant that all students from years 8-13 were able to attend and find out information about future jobs and training opportunities. The careers fair ran from 10am until 5pm which meant that all students and parents/ carers had an opportunity to attend. #### YEAR 11 EMPLOYER INTERVIEWS

As part of the ongoing careers programme at Coombeshead Academy, on Tuesday 17 December, year 11 students took part in a mock job interview with a local employer. The purpose of the interview is to prepare students applying for jobs, training and future post GCSE courses, as well as building their confidence and improving their communication skills. Students prepared a CV in preparation for their interview and were put through their paces during a half an hour interview. Each student was provided with detailed feedback based on confidence in answering questions, confidence and body language. All students represented Coombeshead Academy brilliantly and the feedback from employers was overwhelmingly positive. We are sure that this experience will be extremely important as we continue to support students in making their transition into the wider working world. 
#### **SOUL AND FOLK BAND**

The feedback we received was excellent and the performances from both groups were outstanding. Both groups showcased the talented musicians we have at Coombeshead Academy and represented the school very well




## **CREATE ACADEMY**
