

Learning Cycles

- Each Learning Cycle will be 8-9 weeks long.
- Each Cycle will have a focused Enquiry Question with a History or Geography focus. There are four cycles throughout the course of the school year. Cycles 1 and 3 have a History focus; cycles 2 and 4 have a Geography focus. Within each cycle, all subjects will be covered.
- Cycle 1 is a History focus linked to World War Two, where we are exploring the question: 'What impact did World War Two have on family life in Britain?'

Homework (including reading at home)

- Momework set in Maths and English (reading, grammar and maths)
- Homework set on Atom Learning
- Momework is given out on a Friday and must be completed and handed in by the following Thursday.
- Spellings are added into Reading Logs.



Reading Logs

- Reading logs are the Child's Responsibility
- Reading logs should be in school every day
- Children should record any reading in their Reading Logs
- Reading logs should be signed by an adult once a week
- Reading logs are collected on Thursday and signed by class teachers



Spellings

- Word list are created based on year 6 spelling rules
- Spellings are given as homework and tested on a Friday
- Children are expected to learn spellings during the week
- Handwriting in class will support with spelling words



Expectations

- To encourage children to be more independent and take responsibility for their own learning and development.
- Uniform: The year 6 children need to be role models for the rest of the school. This includes having the correct uniform and looking smart all of the time.
- Presentation: Taking pride in their work.

The SATS assessments will take place in school on the following dates:






