CLASS 'SNAPPY' NEWS

"I spy with my little eye"

Nursery

We've had a sensational week in nursery exploring the world around us using all five senses! We went on a bear hunt—tiptoeing through grass, squelching through mud, and feeling brave along the way! Our barefoot walk had little feet exploring different textures — squishy, smooth, and tickly! We also used our sense of taste by taste testing juices—from sweet apple to zesty orange, their taste buds were tingling!

We explored scented playdough, with lots of curious noses guessing the smells and our feely balloons were full of surprises, helping us guess what's inside just by touch.

A week full of wonder and exploration.

Class 1

We've been having fun learning about our senses in Class 1 this week: smelling, tasting, listening, touching and looking. The children have been

enjoying making lots of smelly potions from herbs, playing the

feely bag game and also tasting different fruit juices and then choosing their favourite flavour.





Class 2

Class 2 have started their new units in Maths and English this week. We have immersed ourselves in many traditional tales and have fixed sentences, so they have capital letters and full stops. In maths we have used part whole models to create addition sentences. In PE we have played attacking and defending games and learnt how to get into space. We have also evaluated

different play structures in DT.





Class 3

Class 3 have been busy writers this term, completing their fantastic guides on "How to Care for Different Dragon Breeds." The children used their imaginations brilliantly and produced some wonderfully creative work!

We are really enjoying our current class read, The Boy at the Back of the Class. As part of our learning, we even tried pomegranate, kindly donated by a parent – a fun (and tasty!) way to connect with the story.

In Art, we explored gestural drawings, experimenting with expressive lines and movement. Everyone loved getting creative and seeing how their artwork could capture energy and emotion.

In the Open the Book assembly, we watched The Gardener story come to life. It was a lovely reminder of kindness, patience, and how small acts can make a big difference.

Class 4

Class 4 have had a really full and exciting week. They took part in first aid training and were fantastic at learning how to stay calm and help others in an emergency. In maths, they've been getting to grips with rounding and estimating, using what they've learnt to solve everyday problems. Our geography lessons have focused on informal settlements, and the children have shown real curiosity about how people live in different parts of the world. We also joined the whole school for our Harvest celebration — a lovely reminder of how

important it is to share, be thankful, and look after one another.





Class 5

Class 5 have welcomed a new member and everyone is delighted!

We have enjoyed learning about factors, multiples, prime numbers and square numbers in maths. In English, we have produced some thorough explanations for processes which interest us individually.

We are now moving onto Kensuke's Kingdom and adding descriptive detail to stories, developing a plot, and characterisation. We have also measured the amount of mould growth on our bread experiments, drawing some interesting conclusions.





Forest School Focus: The Magical World of Mushrooms

This week at Forest School, we explored the **wonderful world of mushrooms**! With so many mushrooms popping up in our outdoor area, the children were full of curiosity and questions. We had some fantastic conversations about just how *fabulous* fungi really are.

We were especially fascinated to learn about the "Wood Wide Web" – the incredible underground network of mycelium that helps mushrooms communicate, heal, and connect the roots of trees. Nature's very own internet!

The children got stuck in (literally!) with **clay play**, creating their own imaginative mushrooms, toad-stools, and even fairy mushroom houses. Their creativity really shone through!

We also tried our hands at **decoupage**, making beautiful mushroom-themed bookmarks using pictures of different fungi species. A wonderful mix of art, nature, and fine motor skills.

One of the highlights of our week was gathering around the **firepit**, where we shared some **funny mushroom jokes**. Laughter echoed through the woods as we all agreed—we know that *mushrooms are* such fun guys, they get invited to every party!

A huge thank you to the helpful children in **Class 5** who raked and planted **wildflower seeds** in our dedicated wildflower area. We can't wait to see a burst of colour when they bloom next summer!

And a big **thank you to Nursery**, who helped to create a cosy **hedgehog home**! We had so much fun **tucking it under a blanket of colourful autumn leaves**—the perfect hiding spot for a sleepy hedgehog as the weather turns colder.

Another sunny, joyful week of learning, exploring, and connecting with nature at Forest School.





















First aid—Mini Medics

Over the last week, our children have taken an exciting and important step in learning how to help others by taking part in first aid training here at school.

The sessions were specially designed for primary-aged children and delivered by Liz from Mini First Aid who made learning about safety and first aid both fun and practical. Through hands-on activities, discussions and demonstrations, the children discovered what to do in common situations such as minor cuts and grazes, burns, embedded objects, nosebleeds and choking. The children were taught essential first aid skills to help them respond confidently in an emergency.

They also learned how to:

- Stay calm and get help in an emergency
- Call 999, 112 or 911 and explain what's happened
- Use basic first aid skills, including CPR, safely and confidently

Our young first aiders showed fantastic enthusiasm, as you will see from the following comments:

"I enjoyed learning about first aid, and I had fun. Liz, who taught us, was great and very informative".

"I liked learning about first aid. It was really fun. I think it is good that we learn how to help in an emergency".

After we've received a referral, our experts decide whether the child or young person needs specialist care from CFHD.

If they do, the child or young person and their family will receive care from one or more CFHD Pathways depending on their particular needs.



Can you complete the sequences? Can you create any of your own?




Miss Burt's Recommended Read:





Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics


