Attendance

At Sherdley, we know how important it is for children to be in school every day and on time.

Coming to school regularly, helps your child learn, feel happy and safe, make friends, and enjoy all the exciting activities that we offer.

Every day counts. Is your child in?



What we expect from our families

To help your child attend as much school as possible, you can:

Promote positive and healthy attendance patterns with your child and set good bedtime and morning routines.

Ensure your child arrives at school every day, on time and equipped and ready to learn. If you might be late, please come anyway. This is better than staying off all day.

Ensure we have at least three up-to-date addresses and telephone numbers so we can contact you quickly when required.

Report absence via our School App before 8:30am each day until your child returns to school.

Ensure medical appointments are made outside of school time.

Avoid making holiday requests during term time.

Contact school if you are experiencing difficulty getting your child to attend school.

Work with the school and any other agencies of support to resolve any difficulties which may affect regular school attendance.

Attendance - What you can expect from us

Celebration of excellent attendance that is above 96% on a weekly and termly basis in assemblies and via our school app.

Celebration of excellent punctuality on a weekly and termly basis in assemblies and via our school app.

We will write to you to inform you of your child's attendance. This includes if attendance falls below the government expectations. **This is our statutory duty.**

We trust you when you tell us your child is ill, however, if this falls low, we must write to you and inform you. We may then request evidence to authorise your child's absences.

An onsite Attendance Support worker – Mrs Eccleston – is dedicated to working with children, families and staff to improve attendance each and every day.

Our pastoral team work closely with pupils to help them feel confident, happy, and ready to learn. By offering guidance and encouragement, we support every child to aim high and achieve their full potential—both in and out of the classroom.

The children were an absolute credit to our school and their families.

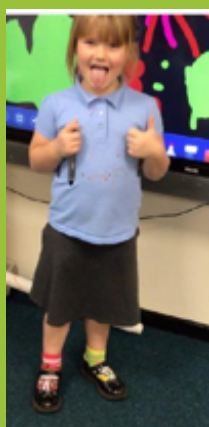




Spotlight on Anti-Bullying Week – 10th November

Spotlight on year 5 - Bikeability

At the end of Autumn 1, our Year 5 children took part in Bikeability Level 1 & 2 training. Everyone who joined could already ride a bike on their own, and the sessions helped them to become more confident and safe cyclists.

We began by practising on the school playground, learning how to check our bikes and make sure they were safe to ride. Once the instructors were happy that everyone was ready, we moved out onto the quiet local roads around school to practise real-life cycling skills.

The children worked in small groups of six with two trained instructors, who taught them how to ride safely, signal, and look out for traffic.

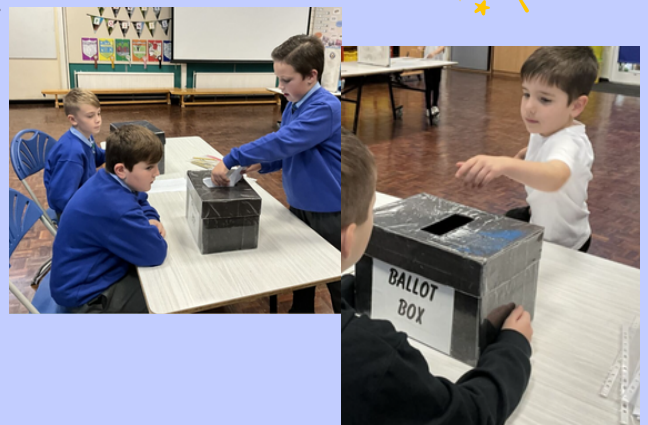
