Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been another busy and exciting week at Stoke Fleming Primary School, with our children taking part in a wide range of wonderful learning opportunities.

This week across the school, we have also been taking part in the RSPB's *Big Bird Watch*. The children were given recording sheets and tasked with observing and recording the number of different bird species spotted around our school grounds. This has not only been a fantastic way to connect with nature but also an opportunity to develop the children's observation and data collection skills.

The data collected by the children will be passed on to the RSPB to contribute to a nationwide survey, helping to monitor bird populations in different localities and assess how they are changing over time. The children thoroughly enjoyed taking part in this meaningful activity, and it's wonderful to see them engaging in a project that promotes both scientific thinking and environmental awareness.

We are fortunate to have such a rich natural environment around our school, which provides the perfect setting for this kind of learning experience. If you have time this weekend, why not take part in the Big Bird Watch at home and see what birds you can spot in your own garden or local area?

On Thursday afternoon, I had the privilege of accompanying some of our Year 6 children to Dartmouth Academy for Youth Speaks. This is a public speaking competition organised by Rotary International, designed to develop young people's communication skills, including debating, presenting, and performing. I was incredibly proud of the children who represented our school with such confidence and skill. We entered four teams, and I'm thrilled to share that Stoke Fleming B team won the Dartmouth heat.

On Friday, Phase 3 enjoyed a memorable trip to Torcross as a culmination of their learning about World War 2 and its impact on our local area. The children learned about the Sherman Tank at Torcross and the poignant history behind its presence there. We then visited the memorial to commemorate the servicemen who lost their lives during Operation Tiger. To round off the day, we enjoyed a scenic walk around Slapton Ley. The children had a fantastic time, and it was a reminder of how fortunate we are to live in such a beautiful and historically rich part of the country.

This week, I also met with the Friends of the School to reflect on the incredible progress we've made so far this year and to plan for exciting future projects and fundraising ideas. I want to extend my heartfelt thanks to all of you who support the school so generously with your time, energy, and ideas. Our SEND Holiday Clubs in South Devon are forest school inspired nature days for children with Special Education Needs and SEMH difficulties held at the beautiful Living Projects (Pondfields) in Dartington near Totnes.

The sessions are held by experienced forest school leaders and therapeutic leaders with a wealth of knowledge and skills and enthusiasm for supporting SEND learners to thrive beyond the class-room.

We keep our groups small with two SEND leaders and a support assistant. Our team hold an enhanced DBS,

relevant safeguarding training and are experienced and certified in administering outdoor and Paediatric first aid.

Each SEND Holiday Club session will be full of games, adventure, outdoor learning, cooking on the fire - an inspiring and nourishing day for all the children.

*These sessions are currently funded by The National Lottery and are run with a suggested donation of £5 - £10 per child. The usual cost of these sessions is £35 per child. Please don't let cost be a barrier, we want to make these sessions as accessible as possible to all - please get in touch to discuss.

NHS Pharmacy First Service

Did you know that the NHS Pharmacy First Service enables children and adults to get convenient access to healthcare advice and treatment where appropriate, for seven common conditions without the potential delay of having to wait for a GP appointment? Accessing the service may mean that can help children feel better and back to school as quickly as possible, as well as supporting parents/carers to also get better if they are unwell with one of the conditions covered under the service.

There is no need to make an appointment; parents or carers can pop into their local Boots pharmacy with their child and ask for help under the service.

Support for the following conditions can be accessed under the service, free of charge (unless NHS prescription charges apply):

Common condition	Patient eligibility
Earache	1 to 17 years
Impetigo	1 year and over
Infected insect bites and stings	1 year and over
Sore throats	5 years and over
Sinusitis	12 years and over
Uncomplicated urinary tract	Women 16 to 64 years
Shingles	18 years and over


