We also discussed the impact of pollution and littering to wildlife and our waterways.

In the museum, they had the opportunity to learn about their local area and to observe artefacts that show the history of Waltham Abbey. As well as learning about significant individuals who originated from our town, they investigated a range of historical objects and discussed reasons why they might be found in this area.
