At Kings Road, we have a required school uniform for several reasons:

- Our uniform unites us as one school family and promotes a sense of pride in the school. It develops a sense of community and belonging towards the school.
- Our uniform is practical and smart, designed with health and safety in mind. It is regarded as suitable for school and good value for money for most parents.
- Our uniform helps to keep us safe. It provides additional security and identifies the children within the school.
- Our uniform makes us all equal. Regardless of level of income, children come to school in the same clothes, making children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance.
- Our uniform looks smart and professional. It sets our aspirations high and pupils come to school ready to learn.

Our school uniform is important to us and all pupils must dress according to the uniform policy. It supports high standards and expectations in all areas of school life – Excellence Without Compromise!

A few reminders for uniform are below but please refer to the full school uniform list for further details:

- Correct colours for school jumpers/cardigans/trousers/religious head wear must be worn.
- School ties should be worn every day. Years 3 – 6 wear house ties and Reception – year 2 wear the school tie. House ties can be purchased from the school office.
- Trainers should not be worn unless it is a PE day. Appropriate school shoes must be worn daily. As we get to the colder weather, boots can be worn but school shoes brought in a bag so that they can be changed into. Boots should not be worn as part of daily footwear in school.
- Fake nails – this is creeping in for some of our older pupils. Please make sure they are removed following a weekend or a holiday.
- PE kit – this should be a plain white tshirt/polo shirt without exception and plain navy-blue school PE shorts (no football attire should be worn at any time). As the weather gets colder, a plain and dark colour tracksuit can be worn. This should not be branded.
