Please continue with your regular tasks - spelling sheets, times tables (use Hit the Button and TT Rockstars), regular reading of your school reading book.

Maths

- Write and solve eight chocolate-themed maths problems. Try to vary the operation required, using + - x ÷ or even fractions.
- Compare the weights of 5 or more different chocolate-based products, then record these in different measurements, remembering the impact of x/÷ by 10/100/1000, e.g. 1kg=1000g.
- 3. Find out the cost of different bars of chocolate in your local shop. List them from cheapest to most expensive.

History/Geography/French

- 1. Can you find out the top 5 chocolate producing countries and list these details about them: continent, capital city, population and climate. Can you locate them on a map too?
- 2. How many products do you have at home that are Fair-trade? List what they are. Why is Fairtrade so important?
- Write a list of the countries around the world where French is spoken. Choose one of the countries and create a fact file about it.
- Make an illustrated French poster of musical instruments. Use Google translate to help.

RE/PSHE/PE

- Chocolate is a tasty treat. Show me what you know about healthy eating by finding out about the Eatwell Wheel and make or draw your own version.
- Complete a throwing and catching challenge. This can be carried out individually, in pairs or in a group. How many times can you throw and catch a ball without dropping it within 2 minutes? Record your results and take a picture if you can.

Art/Design/Music

- Cook a dish including chocolate as an ingredient and take photos to show us.
- Design a disgusting chocolate bar for one of Willy Wonka's enemies! What ingredients would you include? Label your diagram with reasons.
- Make a model of a new room in Willy Wonka's chocolate factory.
- Create an imaginative collage involving chocolate bar wrappers. (you could search 'chocolate wrapper art' on the internet for ideas!)
- Write a 'jingle' for a chocolate bar advert on TV/radio

Computing

- Carry out a survey of favourite chocolate bars in your family and friends. Create a bar graph or other image using a computer program to show your results.
- 2. What can you find out about the history of chocolate-research its journey to the UK.

English

- 1. Write out a recipe including chocolate as an ingredient, remember to use imperative verbs (stir, chop) & adverbs.
- Complete a book review for Charlie and the Chocolate Factory or another book featuring imaginary lands. Why do you recommend this book & who to? What was your favourite part? Who was your favourite character and why? Find an online book review outline, if you prefer.
- 3. Create a storyboard / comic strip, with captions, for a chapter of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory.
- Create a factsheet, video or PowerPoint about how chocolate is made. Think about where cacao comes from and the steps needed to make it into a chocolate bar.
- Write a character description about one of the characters from C & the C F. Include a labelled illustration
- 6. Create your own word search using ideas from Charlie and the Chocolate Factory.

Science

- Could you live on chocolate alone? Find out what you need that chocolate doesn't provide. What should we eat as part of a healthy diet? This links to task PSHE 1.
- Write an information text/poster about how reversible and irreversible changes occur in some materials, e.g., water to ice, back to water & to steam. - 3. Write a list of sounds you find pleasant and unpleasant.
