

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

BTEC Level 3 National Extended Certificate in Health & Social Care

BTECs are a learner-centred approach to the curriculum, with a flexible, unit-based structure which will allow you to apply your knowledge in project-based assessments. This course will provide you with a great opportunity to focus on the development of the practical, interpersonal and thinking skills required to be able to succeed in employment and higher education.

Your studies will include many different disciplines to help you understand people and their needs. It combines biology, sociology, psychology, nutrition and ethics.

The number of units will depend on the size of the qualification you elect to study, but all qualifications will include Human Lifespan Development, Working in Health and Social Care and Meeting Individual Care and Support Needs.

ASSESSMENT

It is mainly classroom based. Units will be assessed by a mixture of external exam and coursework.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Five GCSEs, or equivalent, grade 4 or above are required for entry into Sixth Form to study Level 3 BTEC courses.

Grade 4 or above is required in GCSE English Language.

Grade 4 or above is required in GCSE combined or single Sciences.
