Uniform & PE Days

PE kit: Monday & Thursday

Girls

Winter – Green coat, bottle green skirt/pinafore dress, white blouse, green/white socks, school tie, green cardigan (with school logo) and black shoes

Green Winter hats and scarves are permitted

Summer - Bottle green and white dress (no shorts) and black shoes.

PE kit – White t-shirt(with school logo), blue shorts, trainers, blue Sweatshirt (with logo) tracksuit bottoms.

Boys

Winter – Green coat, green jumper(with school logo), white shirt, school tie, charcoal grey school trousers (shades of grey and black not acceptable) and black shoes.

Bottle Green winter hats and scarves are permitted

Summer – white shirt, school tie, charcoal grey shorts and black shoes.

PE kit –white t-shirt (with school logo), blue shorts, trainers, blue Sweatshirt (with school logo) tracksuit bottoms.

In the interests of health and safety, long hair MUST be tied back. Hair that is longer than COLLAR LENGTH (girls and boys) must be tied back . No fashion or unusual haircuts and of minimum grade 2 for boys please.

Only green or black hairbands/ribbons are permitted - No other fashion hair accessories.

No jewellery of any kind except watches which can be worn.

Ear-rings should be pierced at the beginning of the Summer holidays to allow time to heal. Children may only wear studs in school which must be removed for PE.



Swimming

- Swimming will begin in the Summer Term.
- Each week, 2 volunteers will walk to the pool and back with the class.
- Children will change in the changing rooms at the pool.
- The instructors will assess the children and a lifeguard will be there at all times.
- This is a compulsory part of the National Curriculum and cannot be opted out of.



Snacks/Drinks

- Children may only bring in fruit / vegetables and water or natural fruit juice.
- Only water is allowed during class time.

Please use these to practice with your child.


Spelling will be on a Thursday afternoon. These will have their score recorded in the diary on



Maths - Fluency Bee



- Years 1-4 do this for 15 minutes every day when they come in from morning break, to build number fluency.
- ► Fluency Bee aims to develop good number sense and fluency for all children. The programme consists of a daily 15-minute lesson, with fully animated PowerPoint slides and optional fluency-based tasks to follow.







KIRFs

- KIRFs or Key Instant Recall Facts support the mental skills and key knowledge that children need to secure for Maths. They include number bonds and times tables, and are particularly useful in developing confidence and understanding in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- These will be shared on the class page every half term so that you can support your child with building fluency with these concepts. This will enable them to apply this knowledge to other areas of Mathematics and to develop higher order thinking, problem solving and
