


Tinkercad with Year 5

In literacy, this half-term, Year 5 have been reading and discussing 'Kensuke's Kingdom'. Drawing inspiration from this, Year 5 have started to design and create their own boat on an online 3D modelling programme called 'Tinkercad'. Before creating their boats, the Year 5 children completed various tutorials on Tinkercad to familiarise themselves with how to code and control shapes to create simple objects, such as a table or stairs.





Nursery

During science week, Nursery enjoyed carrying out lots of different experiments. The children made colourful bread using food colouring and water, it tasted yummy! They also made their own slime and mixed lots of colours together- it was very

messy!



The children followed instructions to make their own playdough and then mixed paint to create the colour of their choice.

Year 2

This term, Year 2 have been investigating plants and learning what plants need to grow healthily. At the start of the term, the children each planted a sunflower seed and a broad bean seed. They have been taking care of the plants, making sure they have enough water and sunlight. The children have been observing them grow and have been surprised with how fast some of them have grown!



Science Week Assembly

Lower Key Stage 2, kicked off Science week with an interactive Science Assembly. The children were invited to investigate how science is used in our everyday lives and how that impacts on the way we live. Some students were invited to plant seeds as part of an ecological study at the University of Southampton. 105 schools across England and Wales are involved in the partnership,

growing 6 different bean seeds from across the World. The University is studying climate change and want to know if our now warmer spring and summer weather will allow all the

seeds to germinate and produce fruits. The garden club will tend the seedlings and plants until they grow to maturity when we will pass on our information to the University.



Year 1

Year 1 have been very busy learning all about plants in science this half term. They have been looking at the life cycle of a bean. The children have each planted their very own bean each and have been

observing and supporting its growth in our classrooms. Each class has also written instructions on how to plant a bean. Here are some of our super plants that have started to grow this week...

They have also been learning about common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees.

The children have been labelling parts of a flowering plant and discussing each parts function.

Well done Year 1 you have shown such

enthusiasm and curiosity this topic!



Ramadan and Eid - Year 4

Year 4 have been learning about Ramadan and Eid in RE. The children had a look at why Muslims fast, how they spend the month of Ramadan and why the month is so important to them.

They decided to present an Eid play to parents and carers, with all the interesting information they had learned about in their RE lessons. The children created a variety of different art pieces such as; henna designs, care packages, Eid party posters and Eid party invitations. They also had the pleasure of having music experts come in and teach us a lovely Eid song. The children performed exceptionally to their parents/carers, and it was a great learning opportunity for all.

Attendance

We aim for all pupils to achieve an attendance of 96.5% across the academic year. We acknowledge that there are times when genuine illness or extenuating circumstances prevent pupils from attending school, but do ask that they make every effort to attend every day they are able to.

If a pupil achieves an attendance of 85%, they will have missed almost the equivalent of 6 weeks of learning - or half a term - over the course of an academic year! This amount of missed learning is detrimental to their progress and success. Likewise, we have high expectations of our pupils' punctuality. Our school gates open at **8.40am**. Pupils that arrive at 9am, whilst not late, will have missed 20 minutes of learning time; equivalent to almost 14 days during the course of the year!
