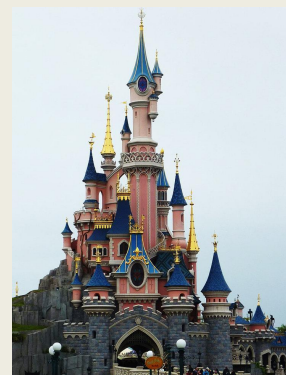
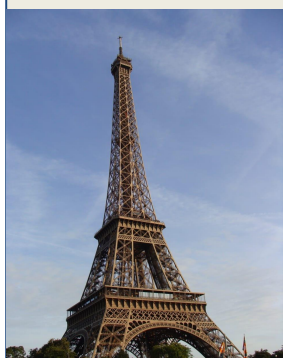
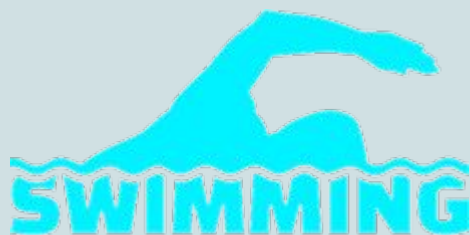


Year 6 PGL Paris 2024

If you need to travel by car please park in the King's Centre Carpark and walk from there! The King's Centre has very kindly agreed for us to use their spacious car park at both drop off and pick up times. At just 0.3 miles from the school (equivalent to a 5 to 10 minute walk or approximately 1000 steps) via a peaceful footpath this ample car parking space offers a safer place to park and an option which avoids the stress of struggling to find a car parking space elsewhere. It's a great way of adding a little more activity and exercise to the start of the day too.
