### **Psychology Bridging Work Part 1**

You will receive and 8 page booklet which provides detail for the Stanford Prison Study. Think about the presentation of your work. It does not necessarily need to be written as notes on lined paper. It could be a poster, leaflet, mind map...

#### A) Summarise the APFC of the study:

- A = Aim (one summary sentence for what the researcher aimed to get out of the study)
- P = Procedure (a summary of how the study was conducted, you should include; how the sample was collected, how many participants took part, where it took place, what props were used to establish the roles of guards and prisoners)
- F = Findings (select at least three things that happened once roles had been established. You should include info about the early termination of the study)
- C = Conclusion (one summary conclusion made by the researcher)

#### B) Pick two of the discussion questions to answer at the end of the booklet.

**CHALLENGE**: Google 'Psychology Today Stanford Prison Experiment' and choose one of the articles to summarise in your own words.

#### Design your own study of gender differences and fears

Write up your investigation. It should include:

- An aim
- A hypothesis
- A brief description of how you conducted the study: sampling & method used to collect data
- A raw table of data
- Data analysis e.g. graph(s)
- · A conclusion that relates back to your hypothesis
