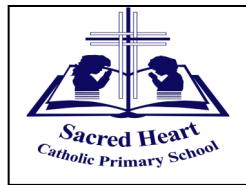

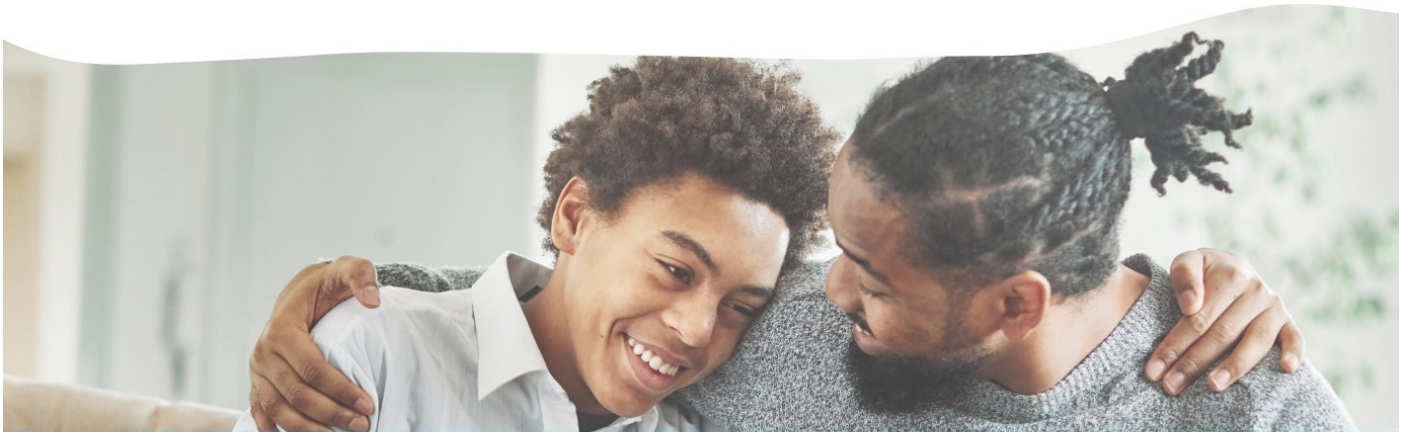
Safeguarding
