
Next Friday (15<sup>th</sup> November) is Children in Need Day. For this day, children can come to school in their own clothes.

### **Prayer and Reflection**

This coming Sunday is Remembrance Sunday, when we remember the service and sacrifice of all those that have defended our freedoms and protected our way of life.

In the spring of 1915, shortly after losing a friend in Ypres, a Canadian doctor, Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae wrote his now famous poem after seeing poppies growing in battle-scarred fields. It was this poem which inspired the use of poppies as a symbol of remembrance for all those who have fallen in conflict.

In Flanders Fields by John McCrae
In Flanders' fields the poppies blow
Between the crosses, row on row,
That mark our place: and in the sky
The larks, still bravely singing, fly
Scarce heard amid the guns below.
We are the dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,
Loved and were loved, and now we lie
In Flanders' fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe;
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high,
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders' Fields.
